iii. Results Co-Ordinator Report

My mother as an ex-golfer, (she is now 94 so she is a great advert for our game of keeping fit and active and socialising with likeminded people) has always said that it never rains on a golf course and this year she was so so right. We enjoyed great sunshine and very parched fairways. This year has seen very smooth running of the BDLGA App which was only introduced two seasons ago. Thanks for your continuing help in using this App so well. It continues to give us such clarity on the Alliance and the results of the clubs involved, I do not know about you, but I love to see the excitement building throughout the season on how each club is doing.

My other responsibility is to be an active committee member. We work to check the rules of our Alliance and try hard to improve their clarity. A few issues with regards safeguarding and correct behaviour have occurred this year and we are continuing to improve the guidance for you. We have avoided the cancellation of matches due to flooded greens that we experienced last year, and fielding of full teams has been great (I thank you for that as know how difficult this is sometimes) and for those with several teams monitoring of your Top 7 has gone well.

Thanks again for your hard work as Captains of your team, I truly appreciate the work that goes into being a Captain, but I hope you enjoy it as much as I enjoy this role. iv. Championship Secretary's Report

The West of England Amateur Open Ladies Championship was hosted at Bath Golf Club on Sunday 8th June 2025. Once again, a very big thanks goes to Diney Costello for being our main sponsor. Diney's continued support and enthusiasm to encourage our best golfing women players is really appreciated. We are grateful to both Somerset Ladies County Golf Association and Gloucestershire Ladies Golf Association for their ongoing support, without which it would not be possible to attract and encourage an elite field of female golfers.

Many thanks to the referees Jeanette Cook and Janet Fear who both did an excellent job. The BDLGA committee and the many volunteers that Bath Golf Club and Lansdown provided much needed help on the day to ensure the smooth running of the competition. Many of the competitors commented on how grateful they were to the ball spotters, the starters and for the warm welcome they received from the volunteers and staff in the clubhouse.

A total of forty competitors played in the Championship to compete for the Harper Salver (Gross) and the Costello Trophy (Nett). The competition attracts the very best golfers with almost half being scratch golfers or below. For the first time the competition was played from the white tees, which was well received from most of the competitors, and we are delighted to say we have a new course record of seventy-six, level par by Isobel Kelly from Aberdovey.

The course was in beautiful condition, and the golf was exceptional.

Annie currently runs her own business having retired from running someone else's for 18 years. Annie is pleased to hold the position of the Somerset Representative for this period to give something back to the BDGLA, as it has brought her a tremendous amount of pleasure to be part of the League. She would like to think that she has gained the necessary experience to draw on over the last 24 years.

11. Chair's closing remarks

It has been a fascinating year. As a committee we have worked well together. We have had some wide-ranging discussions, many of which were drawn to our attention by you, the Clubs of the Alliance. As you will have seen from all the orange and yellow ink on the Rules and Regulations, the Committee has added to and endeavoured to clarify some of the areas where questions have been raised. It is amazing how much time it all takes up. This is not a complaint, it is good to hear from you. We try to be responsive to all your queries and questions. I can assure you that we talk everything through before a decision is made. We have set aside a few minutes after the close of the AGM, in case anyone has any issues, they would like the Committee to consider going forward.

I would like to report on the results of the latest Bath Aqua Bowl Challenge match which takes place, each year between the winners of Division One of the Alliance and the winner of the Cotswold league. On the 13th April Bristol and Clifton hosted the ladies from Minchinhampton in a close fought contest. Congratulations to Bristol and Clifton for winning the Challenge, and being awarded the Aqua Bowl Trophy. Next year Henbury will represent the Alliance in the Away match against the Cotswold league winners, once again, Minchinhampton. This match will take place on the 15th April, 2026 at Minchinhampton.

There are one or two areas I would like to highlight: It does not happen very often, but we do hear of incidents of poor Sportsmanship during some of the matches. We all want to go out and play golf in a friendly competitive manner, observing the Etiquette of Golf. When issues do occur; it is really up to the home club of the player who transgresses to take action, this Committee cannot discipline players. We have added two of England Golf Policies to assist the Team Captains with conduct on the course. There is also a Code of Conduct for Parents to support young girls under the age of 16 in the Alliance. The BDLGA encourages young people to play in the Alliance, provided that the code of conduct in golf is followed. It is the responsibility of the individual clubs to deal with any issues. Please remember to notify the home team captains if the visiting team has players that a) require a buggy, or b) are under the age of 16.

The buggy policy is a requirement, to ensure that a buggy is available for your use.

Some clubs may, in fact, require Juniors under the age of 16 to be accompanied by another adult. It is also a courtesy to advise the home team that youngsters will be among the visiting players.

One area of concern is the lack of volunteers to join the BDLGA Committee. We are most grateful that Annie Patten will be joining us this year, as Somerset Rep. However, at the moment we have 3 members of the Committee who have completed their 3-year terms, but because they are still enjoying the challenge, have all agreed to serve for one extra year. The job descriptions for the positions of Secretary, Treasurer and Results Coordinator have been advertised for most of this year. It would be helpful for a volunteers to shadow these positions during this year. It is not onerous, being on the Committee, in fact it is very interesting. We meet 3/4 times a year and communicate through email and WhatsApp. Without a functioning Committee it is going to be a problem for the League going forward. If you have enjoyed playing Alliance Golf, please consider joining the Committee. Please speak to one of us after the meeting if you have any question.

We hope you have all enjoyed playing golf with the Alliance this year. We try hard to provide a competitive, fair, framework for everyone. Make sure you check out the website; there is a lot of information there. Good luck for the 2026 season and have a safe journey home.
